

Giving Kosovo 2022 Report on the state of philanthropy

HOW DOES KOSOVO SUPPORT INDIVIDUALS AND FAMILIES?

From 2018 to 2022, citizens and companies in Kosovo donated more than 4 million EUR to support individuals and families through 3,246 instances of giving. The highest amount of donations given to this group was reached in 2020, totaling over 2.6 million EUR. In 2022, individuals and families were supported with more than 232 thousand EUR through 363 instances of giving.





How does the Diaspora support Individuals and Families?

In 2020, diaspora support reached its peak, channeling more than 1.4 million EUR through 126 instances of giving. In 2022, the diaspora supported individuals and families with more than 75.9 thousand EUR through 90 instances of giving.



Who were the Donors in 2022?

Last year, individuals contributed the most and donated 55.7% of the total amount, participating in 37.3% of giving instances.

Which Causes Received the Most Support in Giving for Individuals and Families?

The largest part of the 232,240 EUR raised for the benefit of individuals and families in Kosovo during 2022 was donated with the aim of alleviating poverty. Support to marginalized groups likewise took up a significant share of the sum.



Donations for individuals and families were mostly one-off donations – 95.3% of the donated sum and 81.8% of instances of giving provided short-term support.
