WHO RECEIVED THE MOST IN DONATIONS?

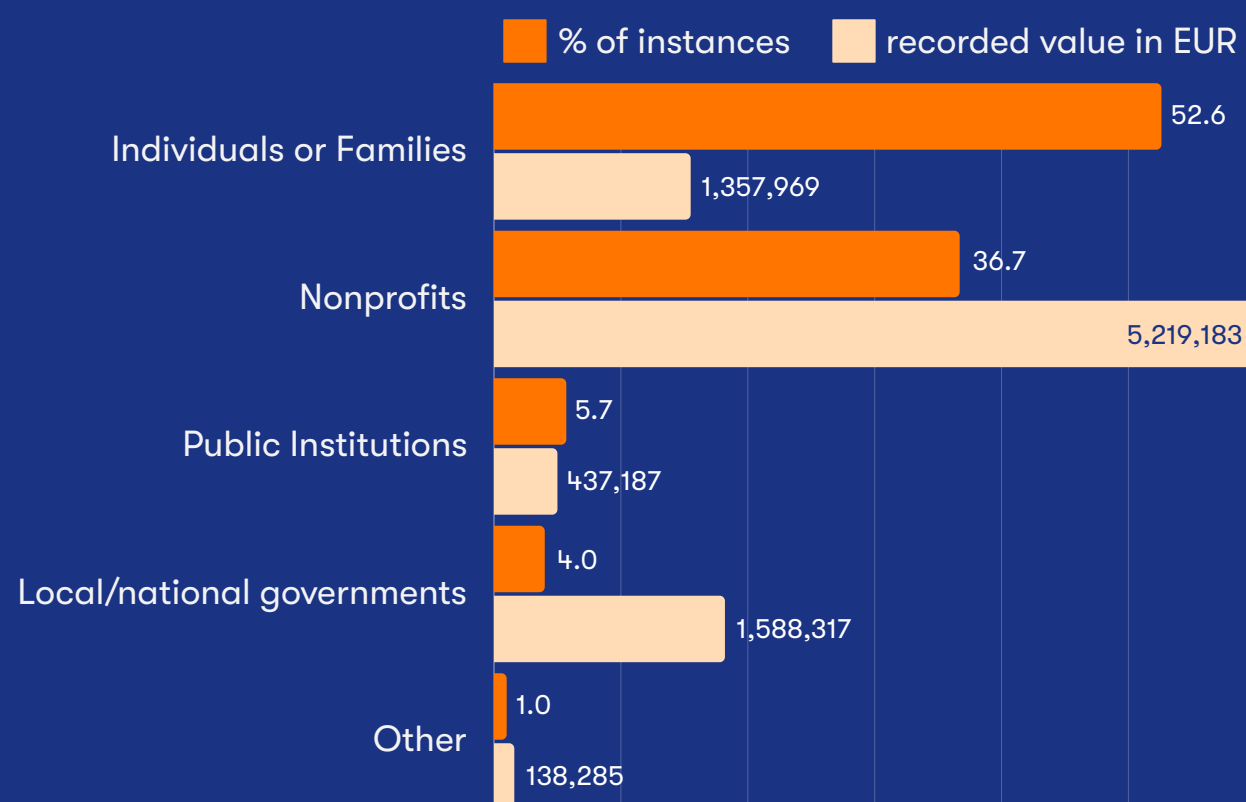
In 2023, individuals and families were the largest category of recipients constituting 52.6% of the total number of donation instances. This marked the return of the trend observed in the preceding years, when donations were predominantly directed toward individuals and families in need.

Recipient Types in Kosovo in 2023



Nonprofits (associations and private foundations) received more than half (59.7%) of the total recorded value in 2023.



Donor attention towards giving to the state remained consistent from the previous year, comprising 9.7% of donation instances, with a focus primarily on education institutions (3.5%) and institutions of local/national governments (4%).
