HOW DOES KOSOVO SUPPORT EDUCATION?

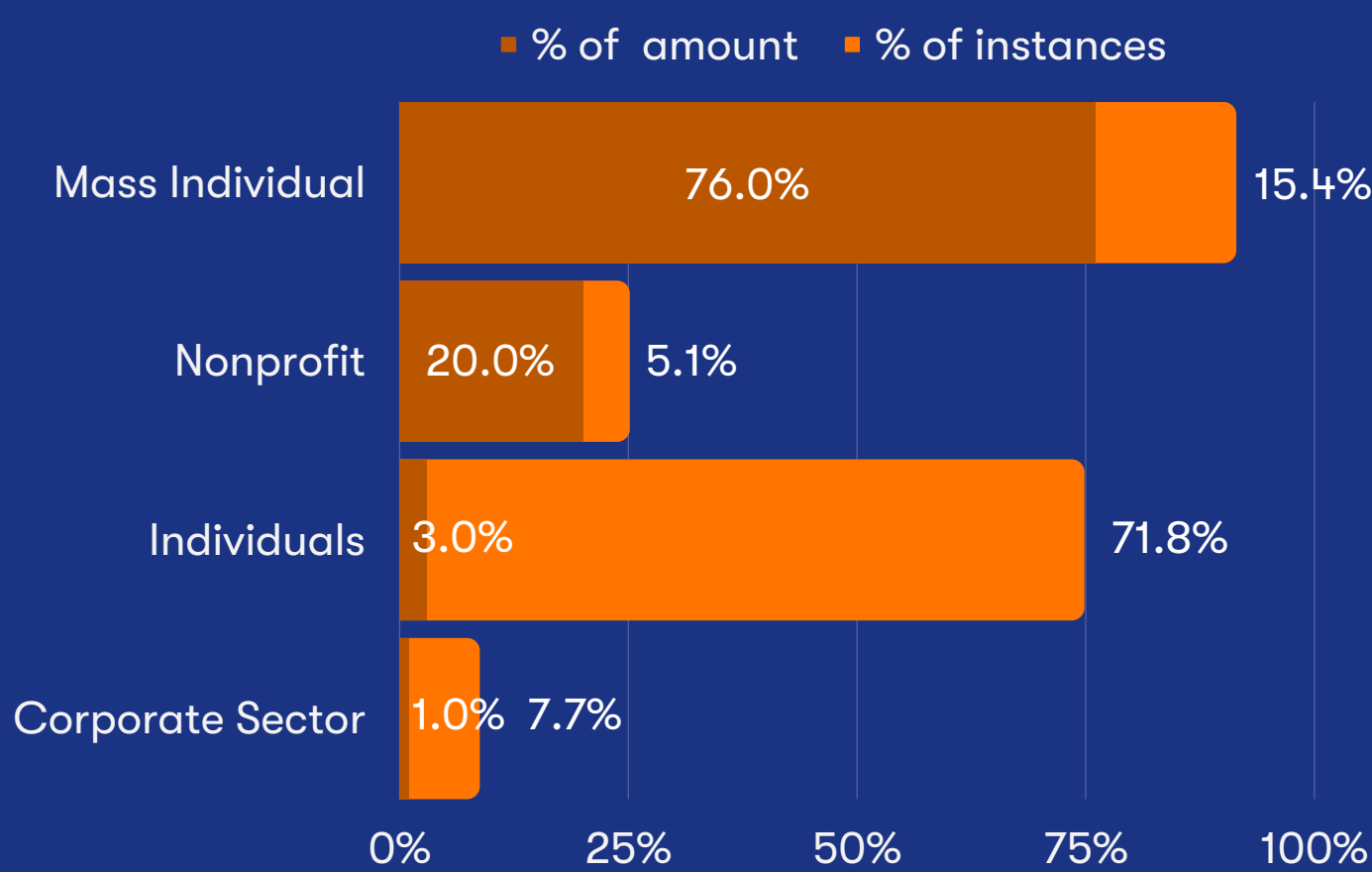
From 2018 to 2022, citizens and companies have donated over 17 million EUR for education in Kosovo through 366 instances of philanthropic giving. Giving for education has been the most intense in 2020, when more than 7.7 million EUR have been raised in efforts to overcome the effects of lockdowns and interrupted school terms.

Trends in Giving for Education in Kosovo 2018 - 2022



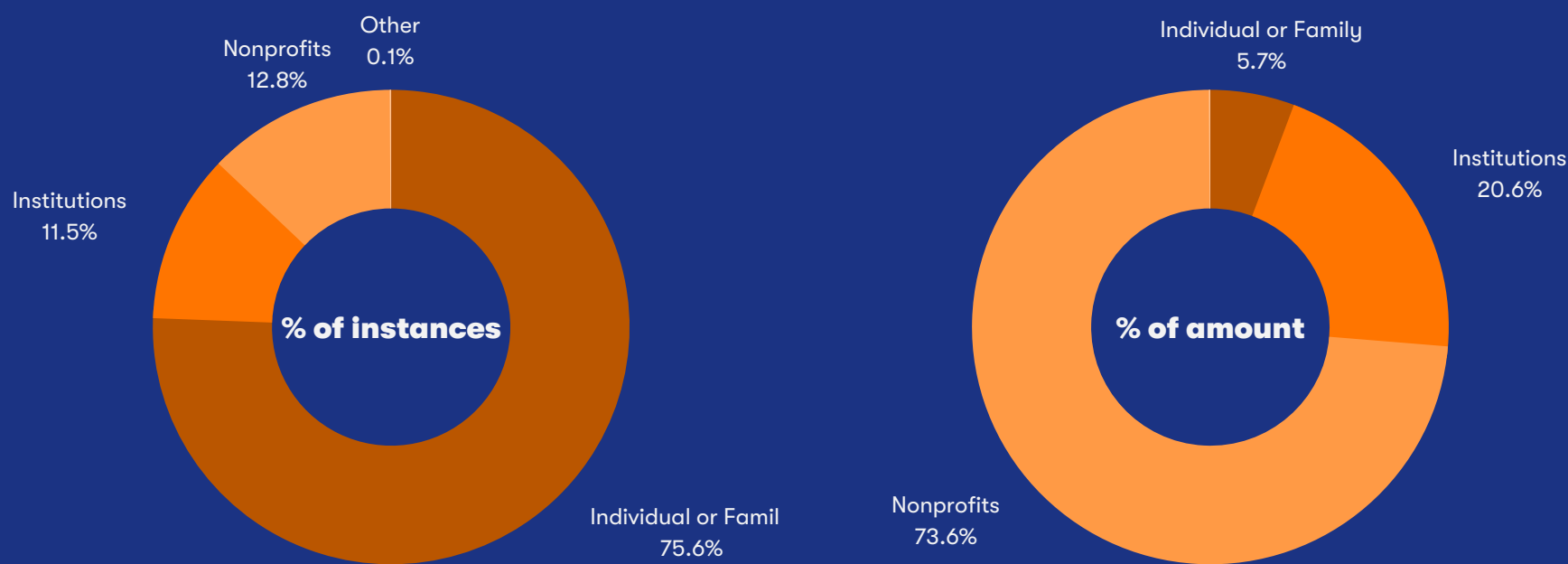
Who Gave The Most for Education in Kosovo in 2022?

In 2022, more than 150 thousand EUR were donated for education. Citizens, through mass giving, donated the largest amount, while individuals participated in the greatest number of instances of giving.



Who Received Support for Education in Kosovo in 2022?

In 2022 donors contributed most commonly through nonprofit organizations. In terms of instances of giving, the largest percentage was toward individuals or families.



The focus in 2022 shifts away from funding education for talented children towards uplifting education in local communities in general. Local communities have benefited from 83.0% of the donated sum.



Considering these trends, it is unsurprising to see strategic giving for education in Kosovo to be on the rise, with 84.6% of instances of giving for the cause in 2022 being long-term donations.
