


Giving Kosovo 2022 REPORT ON THE STATE OF PHILANTHROPY


WHO GETS THE SUPPORT?

In 2022, Kosovo saw a shift in philanthropy, with majority donations going to nonprofits (53.6%), while direct giving to individuals/families dropped to 39.5%. Government/institutions received 3.2%, including a significant portion for the Security Fund.

Nonprofits led recipient trends, with 53.6% of donations; domestic associations were the most frequent recipients within this category.

Direct giving to individuals and families still made up 39.5% of donations, showing continued support for personal needs.





Giving to government and institutions declined, but the Security Fund received substantial backing, comprising nearly 25% of the total recorded amount.
