



Giving to Civil Society IN KOSOVO 2021

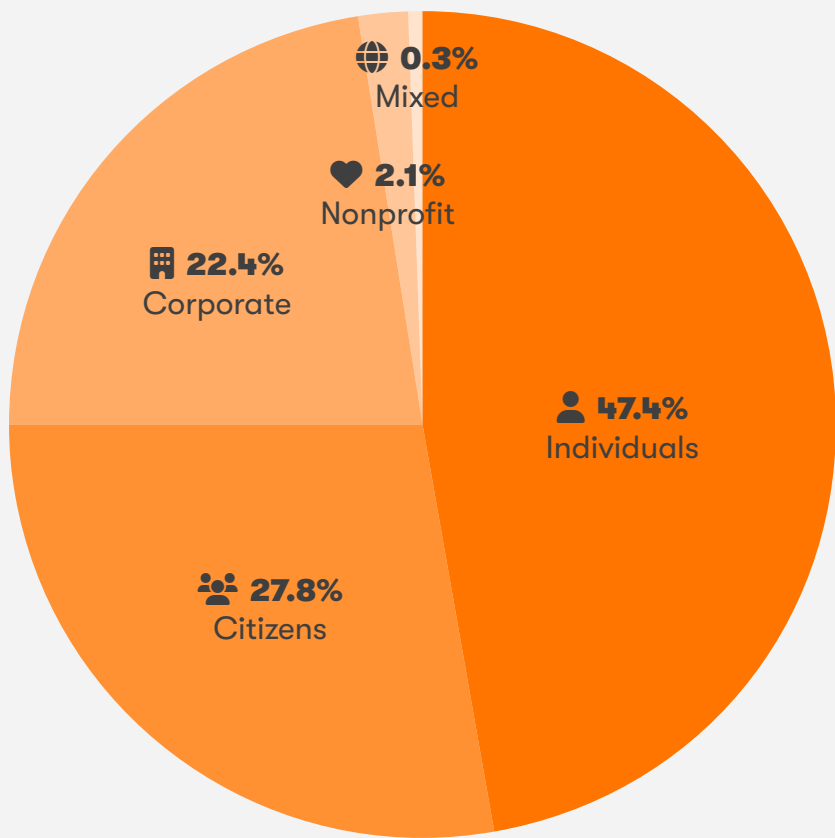
After the pandemic, philanthropic activity in Kosovo returned to the levels of 2019 but support to civil society has markedly increased. The charts below represent shares in the number of instances of giving to civil society.

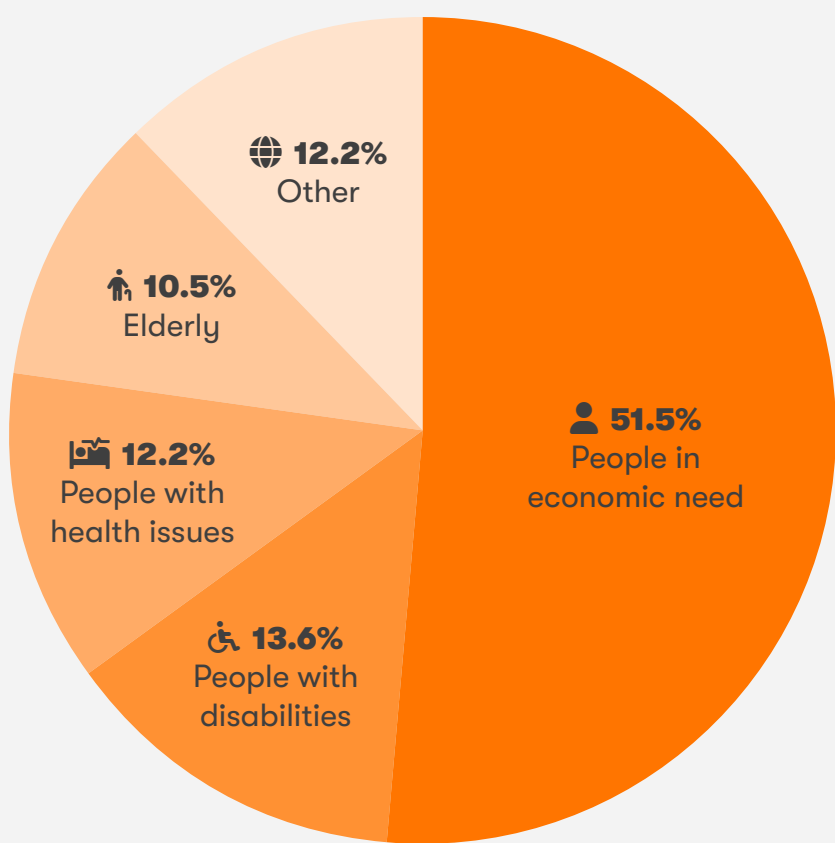
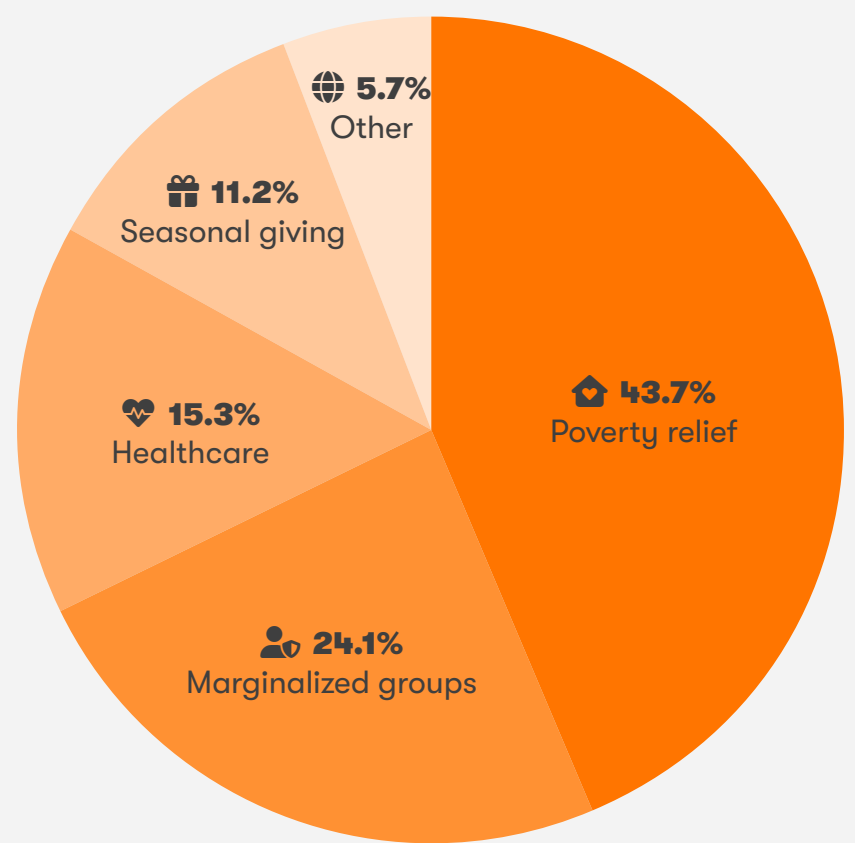


Donors

Individuals were the most active donors in 2021, with a share of almost half of all instances of giving. Regarding the amount donated, the corporate sector was the largest donor, providing 63,2% of the registered amount.

Causes

Most of the donations were traditionally aimed at poverty relief and support to marginalized groups, but a million dollars donated for the development of social entrepreneurship in 2021 has been a game changer in Kosovo's philanthropy.

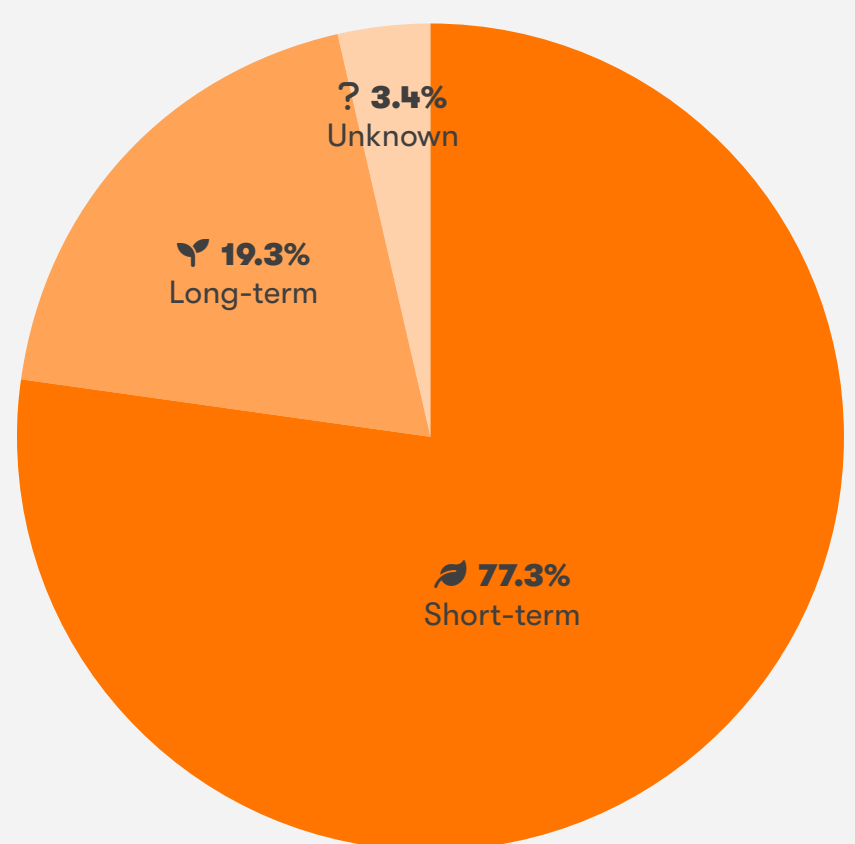


Final beneficiaries

People in need have been the most frequently supported group through the work of civil society. Counting the mentioned million dollar donation, the largest share of the sum was intended for people with disabilities, followed by support for people with health issues at 22%.

Intended effects

77.3% of the donations have been instances of short-term support, mostly providing supplies and medical treatment. Instances of giving with long-term effects such as services, capital investments and equipment donations were fewer but generated the largest share of the donated sum.
