

Kosovo Giving to CSOs 2022

The frequency of support to CSOs was at the highest level in 2022 since Catalyst Balkans started tracking philanthropy in Kosovo. More than 2.3 million euros were donated through 493 donation instances. Compared to the year before, an increase of 67% in the number of donated instances to CSOs was recorded.

Causes

Poverty relief remained the primary cause of giving to CSOs in Kosovo. Seasonal giving was the second supported cause, with an increase in instances compared to the previous year. On the other hand, support to marginalized groups saw a drop of 10% compared to 2021.



Donors

While in 2021 most of the donations to CSOs were from individuals, in 2022 citizens through mass individual giving were the most frequent donors. The share of instances from individual donors had dropped, as well as the donated amount from the corporate sector.

Intended Effects of Giving

Donations with short-term intended effects, such as food, clothes, humanitarian support, and other necessities had the largest share of donation instances and value of donations. Donations with long-term effects - equipment, scholarships, services, and capital

investments had a share of 7.9% of all donation instances.
